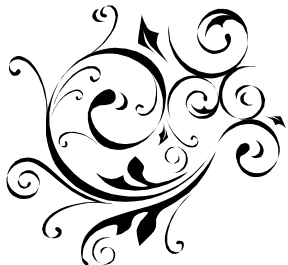


“Tiniest Angels”
