- Our Babies shined down upon us at this year's 25th Annual Walk to Remember. Over 850 bereaved parents, siblings, family and friends gathered to honor and pay tribute to over 870,000 babies lost each year to perinatal death. A sincere thank you to all involved in planning & supporting this special day. Also a sincere thank you to my event leads; Dawn Both-Kim, Laura Reyda, and Carrie Smith. I am forever grateful to them and to all of our sponsors, fundraising champions, donors and volunteers.

- Run4Buffalo, owners Bill & Kristen Craig, hosted, Forever in My Heart run-walk events throughout the month of October to celebrate our children and raise funds for the Wings of Love Memorial Fund. Thank you to co-ambassadors, Ranay Staley and Donna Zimmer for sharing your stories of love and hope, raising awareness for perinatal loss and promoting this event, and Amy Bowser for creating footprint ornaments that were distributed at the October 14th event.

- October 15th, Pregnancy & Infant Loss Awareness Day, The Peace Bridge, Canalside and Niagara Falls were illuminated in Pink and Blue. Amy Buckner hosted, Gavin's Light Memorial Service near Olean, N.Y. and many participate in the International Wave of Light that started at 7:00 pm to remember all babies gone too soon.

- On September 16th, The Pritchett Family held their 4th Annual Ride to Remember, but with a twist. Replacing the annual bike ride due to road construction, they held



a Basket Raffle and a Krolick's Chicken BBQ. A special thank you to all volunteers, especially the Ritter & Pritchett Families, Cub Scout Pack 19, and those who sponsored and supported this event. A little over \$3,000.00 was raised to support the programs of the WNYPBN, including the Remembering Love in a Heart-beat program.

# 25TH ANNUAL WALK TO REMEMBER




The 2017 Walk to Remember celebrated its 25th year as a Memorial Event. The Walk started in a hospital courtyard, lighting a candle and tolling the names of a dozen or so babies lost to perinatal death. It has grown to a true Memorial Walk hosting over 800 Walkers and remembering nearly 1500 babies! Even the most optimistic among those who began this Walk so many years ago would not have imagined the magnitude and outreach the Walk could maintain!

The Walk is always a beautiful tribute to our babies gone too soon! The weather was obliging in that it was relatively warm. However, the wind was bordering on ridiculous! I overheard someone mentioning the wind, saying that the best part of a windy day was that you got a new hairstyle every 30 seconds! But I've also heard it told, as a Native American custom and belief, that the wind carries the souls of your loved ones. If that is true, our babies were out in full force telling us all how much we are loved and that they miss us, too.

There were a few changes this year. Firstly, registration took place completely online. This worked out very well for those of us who record the registration information! There were a few families that did not have internet access, but we definitely registered

them when they called the office to let us know. The WNYPB will ALWAYS be there for families who have had losses, and as the designer of the program, I will always put your babies' names in the listing. There were a few families who contacted me that they were sad they missed the registration deadline because they wanted their child(ren)'s names in the program. They were.

Another big change in the event this year was that all pre-registered families were given a balloon to release during the ceremony. The Walk committee works very hard at making the balloon release environmentally friendly. The balloons, string and paper stars (that families attached to the balloons) were all biodegradable. We continue to request that individuals do not bring their own balloons to release during the event for environmental reasons.

Finally, as a thank you to those who pre-registered, we created a Remembrance Wall. Baby names were listed in loving memory and displayed on the main stage area. It was a beautiful tribute to our babies, and I for one, hope to do this again next year!

As Walkers entered Cheektowaga town park and gave information at the registration tables, they were able to view the Bradford Pear Tree that was planted in loving memory of our babies. The beautiful paving stone that commemorates the tree as a Walk to Remember acknowledgement was also on display. Families were encouraged to write notes to their babies to be planted with the

tree. The note papers will break down, nourish the tree and encourage life!


The Kids' Zone was again wonderful with bounce houses, and Mandos the Clown making balloon animals and swords. There were also arts and crafts, as well as popcorn and games. This area has become an integral part of the Walk, as it allows families to reflect on the day while their children are occupied and looked after.

There is always so much information and other memorial items under the pavilion that it is hard to mention them all. I would like to thank everyone who helped at each of the tables, volunteering their time to help the bereaved families the day of the Walk.

As the Event began and families started moving to the seating area for the service, the air was filled with the beautiful sounds of "Amazing Grace" being played deftly and emotionally on the saxophone by Justin Lackie. Christine Scott, the WNYPB Executive Director, emceed the event and thanked and welcomed all in attendance. Senator Tim Kennedy, bereaved father of Brigid Nicole, gave a declaration about Pregnancy and Infant Loss Awareness Month and a

heart-felt testimony of his and his wife's experience with the Walk to Remember. Fr. Duke Zajac gave a blessing over those who were in attendance, that they may achieve peace in their grief, as well as a blessing over the Pear Tree.

Music and poetry are always a part of the Walk. Music Therapist, Abby Unger, blessed us with her beautiful voice, as did little Sebastian "Bashy" Buckner (brother of Gavin Joseph Buckner). Poems were read by Mia Anderson (bereaved sister of Michael Anthony Anderson), Kristen Quinn (bereaved mother of Nina Sage Balascio) and Jenna Wall (bereaved mother of Taylor Noel, Ethan Dean and Emma Renae). These amazing tributes to our babies gone too soon brought tears to all eyes and helped in healing a bit of interminable grief.

As a special tribute, Senator Kennedy and Christine Scott released 25 Monarch Butterflies as a sign of hope while Abby Unger sang the Beatles' "Here Comes the Sun." This began the nearly one mile Walk to honor the babies we can only hold in our hearts.

If you have never been to the Walk to Remember, but have lost a baby so precious to you, please know that it is a calm and safe place to cry, grieve and remember. If you missed the Walk this year, we all do hope that you will be able to attend in the future. We will always remember your babies whether you can be there or not.

## REMEMBERING PAT HARTNETT

A memorial marker will be placed in the Lancaster Rural Cemetery's Wings of Love Memorial Garden in honor of Pat Harnett. Here is a message from a dear friend of Pat's, Mary Lynn Acee:

"When I began at BGH in 1989 as a OB-Gyn Social Worker, Pat was extremely welcoming and thus a friendship was born. Pat was THE go to Nurse Practitioner in the OB-Gyn clinic for the doctors, the residents and the NP students. She was always kind, compassionate and non-judgmental with our patients.

She was one of the "founding members" of the WNYPBN and was very active and a strong advocate for our bereaved parents at BGH. In 1995, after six years of being part of the WNYPBN and providing support and counseling to parents and staff, I suffered my own loss. My baby girl, Kara Lynn was born and died on May 25, 1993. I was transferred late at night from BGH to Children's. When the nurse who accompanied

me in the ambulance asked who I might want to be with me, I mentioned Pat. My mother was deceased and family was out of town. Without going into the whole nightmare, Pat came in the middle of the night, called my husband (who had been foolishly sent home to East Aurora) and started orchestrating what needed to be done to help me, in her extremely calm and expert way. Even though she was there as a friend, the staff all knew her expertise and trusted her judgement. It was Pat who diagnosed me with HELLP syndrome—not even my own OB-Gyn practice picked that up!

I use this as my example, but Pat was there for all our patients: be they homeless, mentally ill, HIV+ and everyone in between.

After we all eventually left Kaleida Health, we remained in contact and got together several times a year... always picking up right where we left off.

Pat's sudden death while at her home in Florida came after years of debilitating

COPD due to sarcoidosis. We all had gathered just weeks before she died.

She remains in the hearts of many, especially her three children: Tim, Heather and Heidi. With all her babies, Pat was never officially a grandmother but a surrogate one to many and loved her children more than anything.

Thank you for your compassion and help with us wanting to honor our dear friend who was a mother to all our babies.





Soon after I'm back on my feet after weeks of dejection, it is Thanksgiving and then Christmas season. Spending time with family, and momentous holidays, only amplify his absence. We have our traditions that incorporate Andrei into our holidays, but it

is, of course, not the same as having him here.

Spring sends tingles of excitement that after a long winter, warmer weather and more time outdoors is around the corner. My living children burst out the front door excited to jump in puddles, ride tricycles and hunt for bugs. And where is my boy with unbridled energy racing up and down the sidewalks? We walk home from the park and I weep for him.

Summer is busy and filled with fun: playgrounds, beach vacation, family parties. Amid the near constant packing and unpacking of snacks, water bottles, sunscreen and bathing suits, I look for him. I wish I

could will him to appear at the Fourth of July parade wild-eyed and grabbing candy. Sharing photos of my daughters on the jungle gym, I stare hard waiting for him to emerge hanging upside down and grinning triumphantly.

## SUDDEN INFANT AND CHILD DEATH RESOURCE CENTER IS CLOSING

The New York State Department of Health, Division of Family Health, has ended funding for the Sudden Infant and Child Death Resources Center. Due to lack of funding and programmatic changes services ended October 31, 2017.

When the Center began over 40 years ago, it was one of the first federally funded programs in the country to promote a partnership of parents with dedicated health, social services and public health professionals to support bereaved families and understand the complexities of Sudden Infant Death

Syndrome. Over the years research and our understanding of these sudden deaths has evolved. With the federal "Back to Sleep" campaign, we saw one of the greatest public health accomplishments. Implementation of infant sleep positioning education resulted in a 50% reduction in SIDS deaths. We are proud of the role this Center played in educating New York State professionals, parents and caregivers about measures to reduce the risk of SIDS and other sleep related infant deaths. Of equal importance has been our work to support bereaved

families statewide and expanding public awareness.

We have valued our work with our many colleagues across New York State and hope you will continue educating parents and professionals about safe sleep practices and safety measures to care for and protect our infants.


