Since our losses, it has become THE memorial that we never miss. It has become vitally important and a priority in our Family's life. From the 1st year after our 2nd loss, to 10 years later, we have attended. Whether it was raining, snowing, a beautiful day, or even a global pandemic, we were there. Some years looked much different than others, like the Ride to Remember of 2020 – a safe way to still have this important time amid tragedy all around us. 2021 and 2022 also looked much different than the other years. It brought a more toned-down version of our walk with many Covid protocols and park restrictions, but it was beautiful and just what we needed during those times.

This year, 2023 is the 30th Annual Walk to Remember! I have heard from a few parents that have attended since the beginning, and I am sure that they never thought it would have grown into what it is today. We are looking forward to Celebrating our 30th year, as well as honoring the memories of our babies.

Just like in the past few years, we are bringing some changes to the Walk. While we are able to bring back our Memorial Service, Walking the Angel Paths, Kids Zone and Family Picnic, we have seen the overwhelming need for another addition. The "Reflective Walk" will be the opportunity for families or individuals that would like a quiet, more introspective walk around the Angel Path. We had a lot of positive feedback on the model from the past 2 years, where the families can walk anytime, at their own pace, and have the space to treat this day as they personally need it, for their own grief journey. I encourage you to attend this year's Walk on Sunday, October 8th. It will be a place for our community to come together, in a shared grief, to remember all our babies. Whether you need the quiet walk, the Memorial Service, or walking as a community, these options will be available, and we will be there for you.

There's still hope. It's from the bottom that we can begin to heal our way back up to the surface. 
